Carbon Literacy Project – upcoming training dates

In February 2019, Leicester City Council declared a climate emergency. We are working to reduce carbon with the aim of the city becoming zero carbon. In order to raise awareness of the climate emergency, we are using the Carbon Literacy Project as a way of accrediting school staff in becoming Carbon Literate. By the end of 2025, the DfE have said that each school will have a sustainability lead who will have taken part in Carbon Literacy Training. Any school staff, governors, and managers can take part.

Get ready for Leicester's 9th Grow Your Own Grub Mealbarrow Competition

Leicester's Grow Your Own Grub Mealbarrow competition is back and is a great way to encourage food growing in the school community. Coming up in 2026, we have chosen a ‘rainbow theme’ for the

Did you know that thanks to Active Travel England, your school could be eligible to take part in WOW – the walk to school challenge - for free?

[WOW – the walk to school challenge](#) is a pupil-led initiative from UK charity, Living Streets. Pupils self-report how they get to school every day on the WOW Travel Tracker with those who walk, wheel, cycle, scooter or Park and Stride at least once a week awarded collectible WOW badges.



WOW has been helping to reduce congestion and pollution at thousands of schools for 20 years. Last academic year, the Walk to School Outreach project helped create 17.8 million new walking journeys and removed over 3.4 million car km from the roads at peak times.

Good Life Schools – only one place left!

Good Life Schools is a student-led programme for **secondary schools**, working with young people to reimagine ways of living and learning that are good for us, and good for the planet. The programme empowers young people to lead projects on issues they care about, building leadership, teamwork and communication skills. Schools will receive a pack of resources to guide a group of students through a changemaking journey over 10x 40-minute meetings.

Good Life Schools

Schools joining the programme in the 2025/2026 academic year (to start in January 2026) will also receive:

- **£2000 of funding** for Good Life School projects and to cover staff time
- Free teacher training session for your school staff (1-2 hours)
- Free green skills workshops from local community organisations on request
- Invitation to the online Good Life Schools National Summit in the spring term (20 mins)
- Invitation to an in-person Celebration Event with other schools in the summer term (half day)
- Ongoing support from a local Community Engagement Lead
