Qualifications

Typical entry requirements include:

- A-levels or equivalent in a Geography or Science-related discipline.
- Other routes include: Science foundation year/BTEC/Advanced Diploma/Access Courses etc.
 Science courses tend to give you a good base knowledge especially if you end up training in a specialism.

Salary & Progression

A typical entry-level graduate salary is £22,000 dependent on degree, masters and relevant work experience. Great opportunities as you progress.
