What is Eco-Schools Leicester?

Leicester City Council has a dedicated Environmental Education Coordinator based in the Energy and Sustainability Team who works with schools to help them become more sustainable in all that they do.

As well as one-to-one support, schools are able to engage through termly #EcoTeachMeets, staff training, resource planning & workshops, assemblies, Eco-Schools conferences & celebration events and can keep up to date through a dedicated Twitter account, monthly eBulletins and termly newsletters.

The Eco-Schools programme provides exciting opportunities for students in curriculum time as well as outside the classroom. Learning outside the classroom (LOTC) has been identified as 'memorable activities leading to memorable learning and positively contributing to pupil safety'. LOTC provides positive benefits to all groups of young people and supports a rich, relevant, broad and balanced curriculum.

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Eco-School Awards

Schools can register for Eco-Schools for free at www.eco-schools.org.uk/register

There are 3 levels of award: Bronze, Silver and Green Flag which were **updated** in **September 2017**.

At **Bronze** level your school has set up an Eco-committee, carried out a review, created an action plan for one topic and shared this with the whole school.

At **Silver** level your school has done the above plus involved the whole school and wider community and carried out monitoring and evaluation for one indepth piece of work on one of the ten topics. You have also identified where environmental issues are covered in the curriculum.

At **Green Flag Award** status, your school has done all of the above plus carried out in-depth project work for three of the ten topics and developed an Eco-Code which reflects the topics you have worked on.

Bronze and Silver are self-certified online. For Green Flag, schools submit evidence online and are visited by an external assessor at a mutually agreed time.





School EDI-Net Competition

We are encouraging all schools (where possible) to participate in the EDI-Net competitions







Why participate?

Supports your Eco-Schools energy topic Eco-Schools

- Use the Edi-net tools to save energy and money
- Use as a way to engage the whole school and Use as a launch pad for other energy saving campaigns such as <u>Switch Off Fortnight</u> (taking place in November 2018)

Competition 1 – World cup style – compete in week 1 with up to 5 other schools, top 2 move into the next week. *Overall winner is top of the final league table (week 4)*

Competition 2 – Over the entire month, gain points on a daily basis. *Winner is the school with the least points at the end of the month.*

Competition 3 – 3 energy saving days! Whoever appears at the top at the end of the day will be the winner (results can be found the next day) Energy saving days are Thursday 8 November, Tuesday 20 November, Friday 30 November

Edi-net uses smart energy and water data to show improvements in usage based on your own historical data. A reduction since this time last year will show greener faces, an increase since last year will show redder faces. External factors such as external temperature are taken into account.

Smiley faces are calculated on a daily basis and so any changes will be seen the following day

Air Pollution

Poor air quality affects people's health and damages the environment

In Leicester there are two main pollutants of concern: nitrogen dioxide and particulate matter. The main source of these pollutants is road traffic

What is the air quality education programme?

Air quality education will be delivered through a *free* tailored programme of activity and links into the national curriculum

We offer one-to-one support and guidance, with the option of sessions led by the air quality education officer. Tools and resources will be available for teachers to incorporate activities into your lesson plans

Healthier air for Leicester schools award

Awards are linked to school projects you may already be participating in across Eco-Schools, Living Streets, School Run Parking and Sustrans. e.g. Sustrans Big Pedal, and the Living Streets' walk to school project. Offering a unique opportunity to explore air pollution and change the behaviour of the whole school community

Eco-Schools Assessor Training



Once again we are running Eco-Schools assessor training here in Leicester. This will take place on **Tuesday 11 December 2018 between 9.30-3pm**

When schools submit their Green Flag application a volunteer assessor visits for 1-2 hours to assess their application. This days volunteer training will enable volunteers to carry out the assessor visits.

Once the assessor training has been completed, assessors are asked to visit at least 2 schools who have submitted their Green Flag application within 12 months. Encouraging walking as part of an active lifestyle

The Leicester Walking project provides short group walks in the city, encouraging adults to get more active by exploring the city on foot. The walks are free to attend and led by friendly project staff and trained walk volunteers. The Leicester Walking project can work directly with community groups and this offer is now open to schools who are interested in setting up walking groups for their parents. The aim is to support parents in an active lifestyle and encourage them to make more sustainable journeys on foot - a message which links with campaigns to combat school-run parking and traffic congestion in the city. Group walks are very sociable and can help participants feel more confident and motivated to get active and keep active.

"This group is amazing, I love it... first I was really slow but [I've] now built so much confidence in myself".

"I hardly walk, so this has got me and my family to become more active during the weekends".

The project delivers group walks for parents once-a-week for four weeks, led by project staff/ walk volunteers. Walks last between 45 - 60 minutes, starting at the school in the morning (after drop-off) or alternatively at 2pm (before collection), whichever option is most popular with parents. After the initial four weeks, interested parents attend a walk leader mini-training session to enable them to keep their group walking as a self-led group. 
