Leicester City Council has a dedicated Environmental Education Team based in the Energy and Sustainability Team that works with schools to help them become more sustainable in all that they do.

As well as one-to-one support, schools are able to engage through termly #EcoTeachMeets, staff training, resource planning & workshops, assemblies, Eco-Schools conferences & celebration events and can keep up to date through a dedicated Twitter account, monthly eBulletins and termly newsletters.

Eco-Schools programme provides opportunities for students in curriculum time as well as outside the classroom. Learning outside the classroom (LOTC) has been identified as 'memorable activities leading to memorable learning and positively contributing to pupil safety'. LOTC provides positive benefits to all groups of young people and supports a rich, relevant, broad and balanced curriculum.

Eco-School Awards

Schools can register for Eco-Schools for free at www.eco-schools.org.uk/register

There are 3 levels of award: Bronze, Silver and Green Flag which were **updated** in **September 2018**.

At **Bronze** level your school has set up an Eco-committee, carried out a review, created an action plan for three topics and shared this with the whole school.

At **Silver** level your school has done the above plus involved the whole school and wider community and carried out monitoring and evaluation for three indepth pieces of work on three of the ten topics. You have also identified where environmental issues are covered in the curriculum.

At **Green Flag Award** status, your school has done all of the above plus carried out in-depth project work for three of the ten topics and developed an Eco-Code which reflects the topics you have worked on.

Bronze and Silver are self-certified online. For Green Flag, schools submit evidence online and are visited by an external assessor at a mutually agreed time.







We now have 40 Green Flag Eco-Schools in Leicester which puts us in second place nationally. The top authorities are below (the top 3 have similar numbers of schools). Watch out Wirral we are after number 1!





Carbon Literacy Offer for Schools

In February 2019, Leicester City Council declared a climate emergency. We are working to develop a climate emergency programme of action to reduce carbon with aim of the city becoming zero carbon.

In order to raise awareness through the community of Leicester we are using the Carbon Literacy Project as a way of accrediting university students to become carbon literate trainers who will deliver training to school students to make them carbon literate. This exciting project is being delivered in the 2019-20 academic year.

We are offering free training to all primary and secondary students in Leicester City. The project is primarily aimed at Y5 in junior/primary and Y8 in secondary schools, however other year groups can be considered.

The training takes place during a normal school day and a whole class can participate at once. The training will be delivered by Lee and Amy along with university students from DMU and the University of Leicester. You just need to provide a classroom and access to ICT.

The sessions need to take place between late March and July 2020.

Ready Set Ride - Reception and Year 1 - 5-week programme in school. I bring all the equipment. 10 children for roughly 20 - 30 minutes depending on school size. Developing the children's balance and coordination and building throughout the weeks to hopefully getting them onto a pedal bike. Based on the playground but would need indoor space in case bad weather. *1 support staff required.*

Go Ride – Year 5 or 6 – 5-week programme in schools. 15 children for 45 minutes each. Either a full day or half a day. Working on skills on the bike, basics to start with and progressing through the weeks. This is brilliant to work towards School Games or just to give the children a chance to ride the bike and learn skills. This is based on a school field ideally but also a playground. *Doesn't need any support staff*.

Good air quality refers to clean, clear, unpolluted air Clean air is required to maintain the delicate balance of life in earth—not just for humans, but wildlife, vegeration, water and soil. Four air quality is generally considered to be present when pollutants reach high enough concentrations to endange human health and/or the environment.


Less than four weeks to pitch for up to £10k from Crowdfund Leicester

New £25 million funding programme for maintained schools

Interest free funding available for maintained schools over the next 2 years



Salix and the Department for Education have launched a pilot scheme for maintained schools looking to install energy efficiency measures over the summer of 2018. This scheme is designed to help schools reduce their energy spend to the lowest possible level.

The pilot is an opportunity for works to be completed for schools over the summer holidays, to avoid disruption in term time, and will also provide excellent learning going forward.

During the past year, Salix has worked with more than 500 schools and colleges to save on their energy bills and carbon footprint. This new pilot programme means that Salix will be able work with a projected 1,000 schools across the country*.

The Big Spring Clean 2020

Get ready for the Great Spring Clean 2020! In 2019 over 175,055 inspiring children and young people took part, compared to 126,000 last year - making it the biggest-ever school clean up! They were part of a mass-action of over 563,163 volunteer #LitterHeroes who took part in our Great British Spring Clean. Together, they collected 957,377 bags of litter, equal to 4,308 tonnes, from our country's schools, streets, parks, beaches and waterways - litter that could otherwise have ended up in the ocean.

Stand by for more information on how you can get involved in 2020 - whether you want to host a clean-up, join a clean-up, or pledge to do your own thing, they've got you covered. Website registrations will open in January, with clean-ups taking place across the country from **20 March** – **13 April 2020.** Until then, start spreading the word as we prepare to stand together and declare that litter – that degrades the beauty of our environment and threatens to harm wildlife – is not acceptable.

As part of Leicester's commitment we will be taking part in the Leicester Litter Less campaign with over 20 schools out litter picking during this time. Over the next few months our schools will be carrying out litter picks on over a 100 metres from the school gates. We will be celebrating in Abbey Park on Wednesday 22 April 2020 .

Don't forget even if you aren't a Litter Less school you can still take part in the Great British Spring Clean!

In partnership with the International School Grounds Alliance, the three-day event is to be packed with practical workshops and learning from the UK and beyond.

Matt Robinson, Director of Training for Learning through Landscapes comments: "We are here in Scotland to showcase the best of outdoor learning and play. We are now seen as a country who is leading in many related areas — through our policies and practice around play, outdoor learning and learning for sustainability". He continues "outdoor learning has always been a powerful learning context and motivator for pupils. The recent global climate strikes demonstrate that to engage children in global issues in a personal and local way has a significant impact — and school grounds are about as local, accessible and engaging as you can be".

The event has three main streams of workshop – early years, primary and secondary schools and design of outdoor spaces. Over 300 attendees are expected from across schools and early years settings in the UK and beyond.
