# Carbon Literacy training for school students

We are working to develop a climate emergency programme of actions to reduce carbon with aim of the city becoming zero carbon.

We are using the <u>Carbon Literacy</u> principles as a way to raise awareness of carbon and how individuals and group actions can reduce carbon footprints.

The project is primarily aimed at Y5 in Junior & Primary Schools and Y8 in Secondary Schools; however, other year groups can be considered e.g. Y6 post SATS

Training will take place during a normal school day and the whole class can participate at once and will be delivered by the Environmental Education Team along with accredited school staff and students from De Montfort University and the University of Leicester.

#### **Grow Wild Grants**


Grow Wild are looking for creative people aged 14-25 who are buzzing with project ideas to help the environment. Is this you? Do you know someone?

Regreen the desert challenges pupils aged 7-14 to provide a solution for a community in Sudan suffering from drought as a result of climate change. Pupils explore how water pressure works then design and build a simple irrigation system.
