In February 2019, Leicester City Council declared a climate emergency.

Grow Your Own Grub 'Mealbarrow' and Pumpkin Garden Competitions

Following the success of last year's competition, the format of the <u>Grow Your Own Grub 'Mealbarrow' competition</u> will remain the same.

- Students need to design a 3course menu (you don't need to cook the menu)
- Grow at least 5 ingredients in the Mealbarrow (the crops don't need to be ready to harvest when judged)
- Present the Mealbarrow at our showcase event which this year is at Abbey Pumping Station

There is a training twilight session on Thursday 12 March 2020 4.00-5.30pm.

Our brand-new <u>Pumpkin Garden</u> <u>competition</u> will encourage students to grow pumpkins in the school grounds. There will be bonus points for how you use the squash and pumpkins as well as how you deal with the waste e.g. by composting.

A new STEM challenge from Practical Action

Regreen the desert challenges pupils aged 7-14 to provide a solution for a community in Sudan suffering from drought as a result of climate change. Pupils explore how water pressure works then design and build a simple irrigation system. The challenge supports the UK science curriculum and is accredited for a Discovery CREST Awards so perfect for STEM/science clubs and could be used as a project for the Big Bang Fair competition, British Science week and the Great Science Share for Schools.
