Helmets and Hijabs Competition

Helmet Hijabs and Hair' is a competition from **Sustrans** launching on International women's Day weekend 5th - 8th March. **The aim of the campaign is to:**

- Give young women a voice and a platform
- Get young women of ALL backgrounds thinking about cycling as an option for them, including young women from backgrounds that are less represented in the cycling world and who may face additional barriers to cycling and helmet wearing (African, Caribbean, Middle Eastern and South Asian heritage people are under-represented)
- Help ALL young women, and especially those who face additional barriers to helmet wearing and cycling, to feel confident and positive to cycle with a helmet if they want to, including cycling to school

What's the plan?

Secondary School and College aged students will be invited to send in photos of themselves and/or pictures that they have drawn with suggested hairstyles or hijab • styles that will work especially well with cycle helmets.

Our focus is on encouraging and involving young women of Secondary school and college age to cycle, but everyone can take part. Which means clients, volunteers, and staff are all welcome to submit photos.

Beaumont Leys Project Bees Crowdfunder

All you need is BEES! Be part of creating community apiary at Beaumont Leys. Pledge £2 or more to support this project. Money will be taken only if the project will hit its target.

Mowmacre Hill Primary School is in the centre of their community and community apiary will help bring people together through beekeeping. Participants will learn new skills including: how to look after bees, about bees as an important element in the local nature, pollinator plants, how to prepare healthy food and much more.

The project will work with people from different socio-economic backgrounds and support people with additional needs, the aim to improve participant wellbeing.

The community apiary will be based at the school and will be utilised by teachers and pupils to support the curriculum. Children will be learning about bees in practical sessions with the apiary a vital asset in children's learning as part of their curricular and cross-curricular activities in and out of school.
