World Ocean Day – Tuesday 8 June 2021



The Environment Agency, in collaboration with the WWF, will be launching fun educational resources about plastics in the run up to World Ocean Day on Tuesday 8 June.

The resources contain activities and videos centred around an interactive map and are available to schools now! On World Ocean Day, registered schools will be invited to come together virtually for a live question and answer event.

Ocean and Climate Emergency petition and Plastic Free Schools resources!

Surfers Against Sewage's ocean and climate emergency petition provides a platform for pupils to call on the UK government to tackle the ocean and climate crisis. So far, almost 27,000 people have signed the petition, including over 12,500 school pupils! They have also created lesson plans for KS2 and KS3 to help you break down this topic in your classroom.
