COP26: 31 October – 12 November 2021

What is COP26 and why is it important?

You will have heard the term COP26 in the media recently, and perhaps wondered what it stood for, and why it was important. COP26 stands for 'Conference of the Parties' and is held by the United Nations. It is the UN's 26th climate change summit, and this year it began on 31 October in Glasgow and will run until 12 November 2021.





IN PARTNERSHIP WITH ITALY

COP is attended by heads of state, climate experts and campaigners, all with the aim of producing an international response to climate change. With 197 nations preparing to attend, COP26 will be the biggest climate event since COP21 in 2015, where 196 parties signed the Paris Agreement to limit global warming to 1.5 degrees Celsius. It was agreed that every five years they would come back with an updated plan that would reflect their highest ambition at that time.

What will happen at COP26?

At COP26, delegates will be aiming to finalise the Paris Rulebook; the rules needed to implement the 2015 Paris Agreement. Reaching agreement in these negotiations is the UK's formal responsibility as the Presidency of COP26.

Running alongside negotiations is the programme of Presidency for the two-week COP26 summit. The programme kicked off with a World Leaders' Summit on the first two days of the conference, followed by key themed days which put a spotlight on how all parts of society and the global economy can drive climate action. What happens next?

So far, a draft COP26 text has been released, which it's hoped will form the basis of an agreement at the end of the conference, signed by all of the countries attending. This draft text and summaries of conference discussions can be viewed on the <u>United Nations Climate</u> <u>Change Conference website</u>. The latest draft text asks for countries to reveal their plans to massively reduce greenhouse gas emissions at a much faster speed than previously, and also asks developed nations to provide at least double the amount of adaptation finance they give to those countries already suffering from the effects of climate change.

There have been a number of announcements made so far:

- **US-China cooperation:** The US and China pledges to boost climate co-operation over the next decade. The steps were agreed on issues including methane emissions, the transition to clean energy, and de-carbonisation.
- **Trees:** Leaders from more than 100 world countries, representing about 85% of the world/s forests, promised to stop deforestation by 2030.
- **Methane:** A scheme to cut 30% of current methane emissions by 2030 has been agreed by more than 100 countries.
- **Coal:** More than 40 countries including major coal-users Poland, Vietnam and Chile, agreed to shift away from coal.
- Finance: 450 financial organisations, who control \$130trillion between them, agreed to back 'clean' technology such as renewable energy, and direct finance away from fossil fuel-burning industries.

More announcements will be made as the conference begins to wrap up, with negotiations continuing late into the day (Friday 12 November). Keep up to date with the latest COP26 information with <u>BBC News</u>.
