
Young Tree Champions programme

Applications for The Tree Council's Young Tree Champions programme are now open!


Are you ready to take action to tackle the climate and nature crises? Then APPLY NOW and be a Force for Nature.

The inquiry-based learning resource pack aims to help teachers by:


- Changing the focus of climate change from a scary and overwhelming subject to something that can be tackled through collective action.
- Providing teachers with a structured and comprehensive guide to deliver lessons about how human activities are connected to the changing climate, and why the restoration of nature is fundamental to our future.
- Empowering children to take small but collectively significant actions in their communities.

It's designed to support children to:

- Understand the connections between nature, climate change and people.
- Investigate how nature helps our fight against climate change.
- Discover what small and local actions can be taken to give nature a boost in this bigger fight.

There are more than 65 million Christmas jumpers in UK homes. Over 12 million are sold every year! Many are only worn once. Nearly all Christmas jumpers contain plastic.

Schools vs. Climate Change - represent your school, score green goals, play for the planet!

Schools vs. Climate Change is a national schools competition ran by Planet Super League to raise awareness of climate action, whilst having fun and scoring green goals.
