What is Eco-Schools Leicester?



As well as one-to-one support and environmentally linked projects, schools can engage through termly #EcoTeachMeets, staff training, resource planning & workshops, assemblies, Eco-Schools conferences & celebration events and can keep up to date through dedicated social media, monthly eBulletins and termly newsletters. The Eco-Schools programme provides exciting opportunities for students in curriculum time as well as outside the classroom. Learning outside the classroom (LOTC) has been identified as 'memorable activities leading to memorable learning and positively contributing to pupil safety'. LOTC provides positive benefits to all groups of young people and supports a rich, relevant, broad and balanced curriculum. Welcome to the April 2022 Leicester Schools newsletter. Eco-School Awards

Schools can register for Eco-Schools for free at <u>www.eco-schools.org.uk/register</u>

Since September 2021, there have been a number of changes in the Eco-Schools Awards. There is no longer a Bronze and Silver accreditation – schools go direct to the Eco-Schools Green Flag.

Green Flags will now be renewed on an annual basis with an application window open from 1 May until 31 July ever year.

Applications will be **completely done online** to showcase your environmental efforts. There are more questions and an opportunity to achieve Eco-Schools Green Flag with Merit or Distinction.

The new Eco-Schools application online has a **progress bar** which you can see as you complete the application over the year with the students.

Saving the Saffron Brook Updates

The *Saving the Saffron Brook* project has been making good progress. We have started delivering workshops in several schools across the catchment, which have been well received. One of these was a camera trap session at Willow Bank school.

As part of this we positioned a camera by their hedgehog house, which will hopefully provide us with some great footage! Practical work at Knighton spinney and Overdale Juniors is well underway thanks to the help of some fantastic volunteers! They have been hard at work coppicing trees and clearing brambles in the area.

Botanica: Pollinators for Schools



Preparations for wildflower meadows at 10 schools across the city are well underway!

Students from schools taking part in the project have been learning about pollinators and why us humans couldn't live without them – and by supporting them at school and at home, we are helping to stop them from disappearing!

There has also been a lot of hard work happening on the pollinator patches, where groups have been raking and sowing the seeds to start a wildflower meadow growing on their grounds as the weather warms up.

Lower Carbon Lunches for Schools Climate Action Waste Workshop

Leicester City Council's Sustainable Schools Team are launching a workshop for students to raise awareness about the climate impacts of food and to reduce waste associated to school meals in the city.

The workshop will cover four core themes:

- **Energy use** 40% of a schools carbon footprint is energy and its estimated and average of 20% is wasted due to inefficient use.
- **Food waste** It's estimated that 30% of the food we produce globally is wasted. If we were to stop food waste it would eliminate 8% of our total global carbon emissions.
- Packaging waste The embodied carbon emissions in packaging also have an impact and we are considering all packaging not just plastic waste.
- Plant-based meals Animal agriculture and intensive farming account for a significant proportion of greenhouse gas emission and we will explore the benefits of increasing plant based meals in school.



Following the workshop your school will choose to focus on at least one of the core themes and will be supported by the Environmental Education Team to develop an action plan and implement changes.



The workshop is primarily aimed at Key Stage 2/3 but can be adapted for other stages. The workshop can be delivered for up to 30 students and would work well for the school's Eco-Team.

Less Litter for Leicester News

Our Less Litter campaign is off to a flying start with over 30 schools across Leicester and Leicestershire taking part, raising awareness of the problems of litter and helping to keep school grounds and the surrounding areas free from litter.

To launch schools have had litter awareness assemblies delivered by the Sustainable Schools team or by W.I.L.E (Wombles in Litter Education). Schools with a shortage of litter pickers have been able to borrow sets from our partners at LEV (Leicester Environmental Volunteers) or SSPAN and copies of The3Engineers new book – Stop Dropping Litter are making their way to participating primary schools. The competitions for most unusual item picked, the oldest item picked and for the best before and after photos are now happening with prizes kindly provided by Helping Hand.

Preparation is now underway for the celebration event on 27 May at Abbey Park where the achievements of the schools can be recognised, and attendees can take part in a variety of environmental activities as part of our Great Big Green Month.

Great Big Green Month Grants







Following on from the success of great big green week in 2021, Sustainable Schools are putting on a Great Big Green Month during May 2022. The purpose of the month is to celebrate all things sustainable. Plant and grow

Food growing is one of the first steps in healthy eating. Understanding where food comes from can make a difference to children's health. Children are more likely to try new foods if they have grown and or cooked and eaten new food. Apply for the grant and this could go towards; soil, compost, seeds, plant plugs or gardening equipment such as trowel or gloves.

Working in partnership with the Sustainable Schools team at Leicester City Council, and the Wildlife Gardening Forum, environmental education charity Learning though Landscapes have been working with 23 schools and a number of community groups across Leicester City. Each school had a dedicated project officer working with them from May until December 2021, delivering 2 hour sessions each week to the same group of pupils.

The project officially ended in March 2022, and a lot of the participating school groups joined together for a celebration at Saffron Acres!





There were plenty of activities for pupils to get involved in, including creating their own beeswax candles, a drawing competition, a hunt for the biggest minibeast, and a challenge to guess the number of stick insects! There were also speeches from the LtL team and even our own Lee Jowett!









We have really enjoyed working on Polli:Gen project over its long lifetime, and this celebration event was the perfect way to end it! We know that there are now a huge group of students clued up on pollinators, how important they are, and how we can protect them in the future!

Leicester Salix Programme SC



The Salix programme is designed to carry out carbon reduction schemes in maintained schools and other council-owned buildings such as libraries and leisure centres, with a total of 93 sites across Leicester. See a summary of the recent completed works below!

Solar PVs

Blue Sun Energy has recently completed the installation of solar PVs at Imperial Avenue Infant School. The solar panels will help the school to generate their own electricity, reducing their electricity consumption from the grid, which will save money on their energy bills!

Beaumont Leys School has also had their new solar PV panels fitted by installer, InecoEnergy, and solar PV panels have been installed at Knighton Library by installer Energy Saving Lighting (ESL).



New windows

Shaftesbury Junior School has recently had new windows installed through Ashe Construction. The school has already noticed an immediate improvement in heating in their building, and are very pleased with the improved aesthetic of the school's windows. Eco-Schools Training Session 3

Applying for your Green Flag Award, networking with staff from other schools, planning for next year.



This training is open to both attendees of earlier training session and those who did not attend.

This training will:

- Offer guidance and advice for how to apply or renew your Green Flag Award using the new Eco-Schools portal.
- One consistent piece of feedback from school staff is that you need time to complete the application. In response to this we will dedicate a significant chunk of the training to giving you time to start or complete the application with support from the Sustainable Schools Team
- Discussion on how to move forward next year, plan for more environmental action, and gain a Eco-Schools Green Flag with merit or distinction.













In Leicester there are now 52 schools with the prestigious Green Flag Award putting us at number one in England! This training, delivered by Leicester City Council, will provide top tips for gaining or renewing your Eco-Schools Green Flag Award and gaining a merit or distinction. Help and time will be given to begin or complete the application process. There will also be chance to team up with colleagues, in preparation for next academic year.

BESS Energy Sessions

Energy and water are some of the biggest spends for schools after staffing, and Leicester City Council has worked closely to develop an offer as part of the BESS schools to develop tools and reports to empower staff and students to take control of their energy.

Throughout the 2022/23 academic year the Sustainable Schools team will be delivering energy workshops in schools that give students an insight into their school's energy usage. In March, students at Spinney Hill Primary School were able to clearly see the difference between their old windows and newly fitted ones using our thermal imaging camera. Heat detected on the panes showed that the new windows were keeping heat in very effectively, as you can see to the right!

We are happy to be able to offer these very interactive workshops to schools signed up to BESS Energy Enhanced going into the future. Thank you for having us!

earthwatch Tiny Forests

In partnership with the Birmingham 2022 Commonwealth Games, Severn Trent have committed to planting 2,022 acres of native forests across the Midlands to create a carbon neutral legacy in aims of offsetting the carbon emissions from the Games.

One exciting way they're doing this is by planting 72 tiny forests across the midlands. These woodlands, only the size of a tennis court, are planted using a scientific method that allows 600 trees of an array of species to grow over a small area! With a dedicated team of tree keepers keeping everything in check, we can also expect to see these forests grow by a metre every year!

Nine Leicester schools were lucky enough to be able to host a tiny forest on their grounds, and the Sustainable Schools team dropped in to see the hard work taking place (and even plant a couple of trees ourselves!).

Carbon Awareness in Schools









With a climate emergency being declared in Leicester City back in 2019, it is becoming increasingly important to educate our young people about the consequences of carbon emissions. We know that in the coming years job opportunities are likely to have a greater focus on green initiatives and the environment. Now is the perfect chance to broaden your curriculum and inspire your children to make a difference.

We are using the Carbon Literacy Project principles as a way of raising awareness of carbon and supporting young people in committing to actions that can reduce carbon footprints. The learning takes place over a full day

We are looking to expand the reach of this project by offering it as 'enrichment days' for whole year groups. We would deliver the full carbon awareness course for multiple classes in a school hall, or for individual classes if preferred.

The carbon awareness project is free for pupils, but schools have the option of formally accrediting their students at the end of the course for £10 per student with the Carbon Literacy project.

Who would benefit from this project:

All students, particularly when delivered as an enrichment day for multiple classes.

Why participate?

- Enables students to become carbon aware
- Gives students a better understanding of how climate change will affect them and others
- Provides knowledge and skills to develop their own responses to lowering their carbon footprint, and the carbon footprint of others

- Explores the potential impacts of rising greenhouse gasses and a changing climate
- Discusses communicating climate change and practices some techniques for doing so

Schools Climate Action Planner: Supporting your journey to carbon zero


In September 2021, Transform Our World launched its Schools Climate Action Planner, a free, online, easy-to-use action planning tool to help teachers and students prioritise the actions their school can take to reduce its environmental impact.

They are running an interactive session at **4pm on 5 May 2022**, where educators will be introduced to the tool, how it works and how it can support existing projects. We will hear from fellow teachers who have used the tool. They will discuss their experience and the progress they have made on their action plan so far.

During the session, we will also be joined by Let's Go Zero and a Local Authority representative to discuss why it is important for schools to work towards carbon zero.

Leicester Friends of the Earth peat-free gardening campaign

Peat bogs take carbon from the atmosphere and keep it safely tucked away. Over the last 10,000 years, UK peatlands have sequestered 5.5 billion tonnes of carbon – nearly 40 times the amount of carbon stored in our woodlands! Digging it up to use in our gardens releases the carbon and increases climate change.

Leicester Friends of the Earth are asking schools to **commit to using peat-free compost**. Peat-free compost is readily available at garden centres and it is much less damaging to the environment. If you would like to help, please let them know that you are buying peat-free compost and they will add you to the 2022 Leicester & Leicestershire Peat Free List published on their blog. **Seven local schools <u>pledged to</u> <u>go peat-free last year</u> and they hope that many more will join them this year.**
