Carbon Literacy Project

To raise awareness of the climate emergency, we are using the Carbon Literacy Project as a way of accrediting school staff to become Carbon Literate. Tiny Forests 2024/2025

We are currently applying for our final round of Local Authority Treescapes Funding for Tiny Forests in 2024/2025.

Leicester now has 25 Tiny Forests in schools across the city! Tiny Forests are fast-growing miniature woodlands that help to connect people with nature, mitigate the impacts of climate change and provide a nature-rich habitat to support wildlife. Tiny Forests cover the size of a tennis court and include a space to use as an outdoor classroom. Students are involved from start to finish, helping to plant the 600 trees and then monitoring the impact of the forest through citizen science activities.
