Friends of Leicester Friends of the Earth volunteers recently investigated how much wildlife was living the in the City's parks. From this, they have put

together a booklet showcasing all the wonderful wildlife living in 7 of the parks in Leicester. These parks are Hamilton, Spinney Hill, Evington, Humberstone, Willowbrook, Stokeswood and Appleton. The booklet includes illustrations from local artists, descriptions of the parks and even an I-Spy challenge relating to nature in the parks.

The volunteers at Leicester Friends of the Earth are aiming to encourage as many

people as possible engage with nature on their doorsteps (and in the local parks!) by sharing the booklet far and wide. There are a limited number of booklets currently available, but the volunteers are looking to get more printed ready for springtime.
